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# The Show Trials of the Accused “Molly Maguires” Patrick Hester, Peter McHugh and Patrick Tully

From western Allegheny County to eastern Carbon County, Pennsylvania’s coal miners had frightful jobs in the 1800’s. They toiled for 12 hour shifts by the light of candles on their hats, and never saw the sun until Sunday, unless they worked night shifts. Companies flagrantly ignored safety rules and didn’t build escape exits, which weren’t required until 1870 anyway. Accidents killed 235 Pennsylvania miners in 1878. Children tore their hands picking slate from coal and bosses caned them if they picked too slowly. Miners earned under \$2/day to rent overpriced company homes and shop at company stores where prices exceeded the market price by 50%. The Constant exposure to coal dust cut deadly half-inch scars into miners’ lungs.<sup>1</sup> Diseases like consumption, smallpox, scarlet fever, and typhoid spread among cramped company houses to ravage weak-lunged miners and poorly nourished families.<sup>2</sup> In the center of Pittsburgh, the upper Hill District was called “Minersville,” and was impoverished then as it is today. Miners’ wooden houses and the “Minersville cemetery” still sit above coal veins running below the Hill District.<sup>3</sup>

In the 19th century, tens of thousands of Irish fled to Pennsylvania from Ireland's Potato Famine. Their poverty pushed them into the mines' worst jobs. Unions were illegal and companies blacklisted strikers, so Irish miners formed the "Molly Maguire" gang. From 1871-1875 Mollies allegedly burned 10 coal mines at Mount Carmel and Locust Gap.<sup>4</sup>

The Reading Railroad owned most of those mines thanks to Frank Gowen and Pennsylvania's Supreme Court. In 1866 as its attorney, Gowen persuaded the Court to give it a vital rail system. Then the Reading fixed shipping prices, bought competitors, and acquired 125,000 acres of coal.<sup>5</sup>

In 1867 Gowen litigated "Philadelphia & Reading RR. v. Hummell" wherein a train started up against 8 homes without a warning whistle and severed a boy's leg. Jurors found in favor of the boy and Gowen appealed. The Court decided trains had a right to presume nobody would trespass, didn't have to whistle, and could run at full speed. (Yet later in "Pennsylvania RR. v. Lewis," the Court told the Reading's competitor that trains couldn't travel at full speed disregarding likely trespassers). The Reading Railroad was impressed with Gowen's performance, and made him its president. Next, Gowen turned his legal skills on the Mollies.<sup>6</sup>

Gowen blamed the Mollies' sabotage on the "Ancient Order of Hibernians." The AOH was an Irish Catholic fraternity that had its first state convention in Pittsburgh's "Emerald Hall" in 1870. On March 17, 1870 Very Reverend John Hickey, Vicar General of Pittsburgh's Diocese, welcomed the AOH to St Paul's Cathedral, granting ecclesiastical recognition. Miners, mostly Irish, favored the AOH because unlike companies it paid benefits to accident victims. Locust Gap and Mount Carmel's AOH president Patrick Hester was elected Tax Assessor- a miner now taxing companies.<sup>7</sup>

In 1868, Gowen's police shot and jailed robber James Finnely. Before dying in jail, Finnely allegedly accused Hester and Ashland's AOH president Tom Donahue of the Columbia County murder-robbery of mine boss Alexander Rea. Donahue was tried and acquitted. Hester was jailed past 2 court sessions and released untried.<sup>8</sup>

Gowen hired Pinkerton's secret police, who investigated "Mollies" in Carbon, Columbia, Northumberland, and Schuylkill Counties from 1873, and in Westmoreland County from 1875-1878. In 1876 the Reading conducted highly publicized show trials resulting in convictions of over 40 Molly Maguires.<sup>9</sup>

In 1876 Pinkertons promised Manus Kull, a homeless person expelled by the Mollies and in jail for countless armed robberies: accuse Hester of planning Rea's death and go free. Kull agreed, and the robbery conviction he was then serving was pardoned so he could testify. Kull was rewarded with \$1,600.<sup>10</sup>

Pinkertons arrested Hester, AOH Delegate Peter McHugh, and Patrick Tully that November. Although Rea's was the only alleged Molly murder in Hester's Division, newspapers screamed Hester "waded in blood for years." Judge Elwell allowed a Columbia County jury with no Irish Catholics or coal town residents. All jurors knew of the case beforehand. Juror Isaac Dewitt admitted he already had an opinion on the defendants' guilt, and juror Abram White admitted he had an impression on their guilt. But the jurors claimed it wouldn't affect their judgment.<sup>11</sup>

Kull testified Hester said Rea would carry \$18,000 one Saturday and lent him a gun. Kull said Hester wasn't at the murder, nor was Donahue involved. Kull said they didn't discuss killing Rea. He said he, McHugh, and Tully drank whisky and robbed Rea. But trigger-happy Kull "couldn't remember" if he or Tully shot Rea first. The first shot made Rea dash, so they killed him. Rea carried \$60. They divided it, dealing Kull an extra share and Hester none.<sup>12</sup>

Actually, Hester probably didn't plan it, because as tax assessor he knew Rea only delivered wages Fridays. Plus, Kull already had a gun. His claim that Donahue was uninvolved meant either Kull or Finnely lied.<sup>13</sup>

The Reading's paid prosecutor, Francis Hughes, harangued 9 hours on Molly "assassins," calling Hester the "very devil." Judge Elwell instructed that by law planners of unintentionally deadly robberies were guilty of murder. Jurors convicted the 3 prisoners in under 2 hours. Gowen remarked: "The name of Molly Maguire being attached to a man's name is sufficient to hang him."<sup>14</sup>

On October 2, 1877, Pennsylvania's Supreme Court reviewed Hester's case in Pittsburgh's coal-blackened Grant Street courthouse. The Court was in Pittsburgh because that July Pittsburgh's militia refused to shoot strikers. Governor Hartranft sent in the National Guard, which shot and killed 40 civilians. Crowds burned trains for 3 miles. Allegheny County's lawyers

blamed the riot on soldiers. The New York Times reported "not a stick of wood injured... up to the time the troops arrived at Pittsburgh." But in "Gibson's Son & Co. v. Allegheny County" the Court blamed Pittsburgh: "We see no evidence of any serious attempt upon the part of the local authorities to suppress it at the time of its commencement." The Court made Allegheny County pay railroads and merchants \$ \$2,772,349.53.<sup>15</sup>

Gowen personally joined Hughes to argue before the Court against Hester's appeal. Hester's lawyers showed the "1860 Two Term Act" explicitly protected prisoners jailed and untried within 2 court sessions. In 1869 Bloomsburg's Court had released Hester 3 days after his second session in jail without trial. Before Hester was released on the third day, prosecutors had entered a "nol pros" motion not to prosecute Hester. Hester's lawyers appealed that if the Supreme Court wouldn't equate this to an acquittal, theoretically "a prisoner can be re-arrested and imprisoned for the same offence" and "perpetual imprisonment could follow without trial."<sup>16</sup>

Pennsylvania Supreme Court Justice Warren Woodward, the presiding judge in the city of Reading from 1861-1874, gave the court's decision. Woodward said he needn't decide if the Two Term Act barred re-arrest on the same offense (Pennsylvania Courts were divided on the question until 1943). Instead, Woodward made an unprecedented interpretation: prosecutors entered a "nol pros" motion before Bloomsburg's court had released Hester; so the court had released him on the "nol pros" motion instead of the Two Term rule.<sup>17</sup>

Next Hester's lawyers argued "At the time of this trial a strong prejudice existed in this community against the "Ancient Order of Hibernians." Attorney John Freeze complained that in Bloomsburg's trial, prosecutors

blamed the AOH “with every crime that was committed, whether it be an Englishman, an Irishman, or a Welshman.” Defense lawyers argued that Molly “trials in Schuylkill county had just been concluded and it was impossible to obtain an unprejudiced jury. All that seemed necessary was to find that a prisoner was a ‘Mollie Maguire’ and conviction followed.”<sup>18</sup>



Woodward declared that Judge Elwell’s “instructions upon legal questions were so intelligent and so clear as to make their apprehension and application by the jury free from the chance of mistake or doubt. In relation to the general features of the case, there is nothing, therefore, that requires remark.”<sup>19</sup>

According to Pennsylvania Constitution Article 4, passed in 1874: "no pardon shall be granted...except... after full hearing, upon due public notice and in open session." Hester's lawyers said the Pardon Board announced it wouldn't meet on the regularly scheduled hearing date when Kull announced he'd apply. Subpoenaed papers showed the Board didn't certify any notice was given or meeting convened. Further, Kull's pardon didn't fully restate the penalty to be repealed, including returning stolen property. Hester's lawyers claimed Kull's pardon was void, so Kull couldn't testify.<sup>20</sup> Woodward decided: "Upon irregularities and omissions of form such as these, it was proposed that [County] judges... should... annul the deliberate action of the governor taken in the execution of a constitutional power expressly conferred. There was no allegation that the pardon was obtained by fraud or false pretense." Phrased differently: the Constitution allowed the governor to pardon Kull, so Columbia County judges couldn't void this unconstitutionally enacted pardon. Woodward agreed with all Gowen's points.<sup>21</sup>

Although the Court upheld Hester's conviction, 2,600 petitioned for Hester's pardon because Kull's testimony was uncorroborated. The Pardon Board was chaired by Commonwealth Secretary Matthew "Boss" Quay, for whom trains made special stops when he traveled near his Beaver County home.<sup>22</sup>

During the 1877 strike, Quay ordered the National Guard to Pittsburgh while Hartranft was beyond telegraph communication in Wyoming. An Allegheny Grand Jury charged Quay with forging Hartranft's signature on the order, but Quay refused to appear. When RNC member William Kemble was convicted of bribing legislators to pay railroads \$4,000,000 for strike damage, Quay

called the BOP in extra session and pardoned Kemble in 20 minutes. At a legislative hearing, Kemble called bribery “common aid,” and said: “I know the Constitution has got a lot of stuff in it that none of you live up to.”<sup>23</sup> But Hester was a poor lobbyist. Quay denied his petition.<sup>24</sup>

On March 25, 1878, 30 railroad police guarded Bloomsburg’s jail. Hester comforted his wife and 4 daughters whose shrieks penetrated jail walls. Tully’s wife whispered, “I have nothing left now but me broken heart.”<sup>25</sup> At the gallows, Hester threw his chest forward, head back, and said “I did not plot the murder of Rea.” Gowen’s police strapped the 3 prisoners’ legs, and a blindfolded man dropped them. But the drop was too short to break necks. Horrified spectators turned away as Hester breathed heavily, convulsing. Three hearts took 9-12 minutes to stop.<sup>26</sup>

Gowen, the “Ruler of the Reading,” delivered Hester’s body on a special train to a funeral attended by 2,500 mourners. Hester’s nephew John left the area and settled in McKeesport.<sup>27</sup> John’s grandson John P. Hester became a Superior Court judge and sought Hester’s posthumous pardon like that of accused “Molly” Jack Kehoe. “At weddings and wakes, where all the relatives got together, they’d talk about Uncle Paddy,” Judge Hester recalled in his Pittsburgh office. None of them doubted that Hester hadn’t planned the robbery.<sup>28</sup>

Pittsburgh's courthouse burned and was demolished in 1882. In 1892, Homestead strikers fought off 300 attacking Pinkertons. Pennsylvania's Supreme Court, including judges who denied Hester's appeal like Chief Justice Edward Paxson, indicted 33 strikers for treason. Paxson surprisingly appointed himself judge in their county-level trial. He instructed the jury that "It was an act of unlawful violence to prevent" the Pinkertons from landing. But an Allegheny County jury acquitted the strikers. The next year, Paxson was appointed one of three chief managers, or "receivers," of the Reading Railroad. In 1924, Pennsylvania's Supreme Court, with a new set of justices, declared the Reading Railroad a monopoly and divided it.<sup>29</sup>



In 2005, Pennsylvania's House unanimously passed Noncontroversial Resolution No.527, introduced by Perzel (Speaker-R) and Dewese (Majority Leader-D):

[abridged:] WHEREAS alleged Molly Maguires in Columbia County were tried and hanged; employees of the Reading

Railroad investigated, arrested, and prosecuted them; jury selection ensured ethnic bigotry and antipathy; judges were connected with companies instigating the trial, witnesses were intimidated to perjury; to say due process and constitutional rights lacked in the trial would be an understatement; As a result Patrick Hester, Peter McHugh, and Patrick Tully hanged in 1878; RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the lack of Due Process in the trial; and be it further RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives memorialize the Honorable Edward C. Rendell, Governor of the Commonwealth to issue an order acknowledging the same.

In 2006, Pennsylvania's Senate unanimously passed a matching resolution. Resolutions are discussed and approved in Committees, then voted on in the General Assembly. The resolutions mentioned 17 other "Molly Maguires" hanged from 1877-1879 in the largest mass execution in Pennsylvania history. This year, Pittsburgh's state representatives DeLuca, Frankel, Readshaw, and Walko, and Westmoreland Representative Petrarca are sponsoring House Resolution 629 to remind Rendell of the violation of Due Process. Hester, McHugh, and Tully are still awaiting the governor's acknowledgement.



The index contains, in rough alphabetical order, the name of the deceased, the year of death, and the page number of the compiled records where the death information would have been recorded. By locating newspaper obituaries for random individuals on the list, we are able to determine the approximate month(s) of death contained on any given page.

For example, page 2 of the index lists two James Adams, both dying in 1852. One death was recorded on page 17 and another on page 24. Based on the listings given on the next page, the first James Adams died about June of 1852; the second in November of 1852.
