

LATTIMER, ISABELLA GORDON—wife of Joseph Blackford, Sr., died Jun 10th at her home near Martin's Ferry, Belmont County, Ohio in the 66th year of her age.
4 Oct 1871

MCKEE, JAMES B.—suddenly in the city of New Castle, Pa., on the 3d day of August; aged 55 years. Member of the First Presbyterian Church, New Castle for thirty years.
4 Oct 1871

FRANK, MRS. JANE P.—at her residence in Chippewa, Wayne County, Ohio, Sept. 7; aged 73 years and 3 months. Mrs. Frank, with her husband, Mr. Henry Frank, moved from Washington County, Pa., Nov. 1822, to Canaan, Wayne County, Ohio, where they were among the first members of the Presbyterian Church in Jackson. They moved to Chippewa in 1840, where Mr. Frank died in 1862.

MACLEAN, JOHN—at his residence in Freeport, Armstrong County, Pa.; Sept. 6th; aged 82 years, 11 months, and 17 days. He was born in Derry, Westmoreland County, Pa. in the year 1788. He united with the church at Plum Creek. Married over fifty-six years, leaves his wife and six of their nine children to mourn his loss.

FRAZIER, JOHN—in Green Township, Harrison Co., Ohio, July 25th, of pulmonary disease, in the 37th year of his age. Son of John Frazier, of Wayne Township, Jefferson County. Member of the Presbyterian Church of Bloomfield. 4 Oct 1871

SMITH, JOHN B.—July 18th, at the residence of his son-in-law, Mr. Graham, in South Buffalo Twp., Armstrong County, Pa.; age 80 years, 8 months, and 4 days. Member of the U.P. Church, Buffalo, Armstrong County, Pa. 4 Oct 1871

BORLAND, ROBERT MELVIN—Sept. 11th; son of W. P. and Mrs. B. C. Borland; aged 2 years, 4 months, and 4 days. 4 Oct 1871

STUCHELL, JACOB—September 10th, of apoplexy, at his residence in East Mahoning Twp., Indiana Co., Pa.; aged 70 years, lacking 5 days. 4 Oct 1871

BRYAN, MARY JANE—Sept. 29th, in Plum Twp., Allegheny Co., Pa., daughter of Hamilton Bryan; aged 2 years and 8 months. 4 Oct 1871

STEWART, JOSEPH—Sept. 9th, near Elderton, Pa., in the 70th year of his age.

REED, LYDIA MAGGIE—September 13th; daughter of Samuel M. and Ellen Reed; aged 3 years. (Phila. Presbyterian, please copy) 4 Oct 1871

ALLEN, THOMAS—Sept. 8th, in the 78th year of his age. Mr. Allen was a soldier in the war of 1812 and a highly respected citizen. 11 Oct 1871

RIGGS, SAMUEL T., ESQ.—on the 3rd of September at his late residence in Pawnee, Bourbon Count, Kansas, in the 64th year of his age. His death leaves Rev. Dr. Riggs, of Beaver, Pa. as the only surviving member off the family of Rev. Cyrus Riggs, deceased, who was long a member of the old Presbytery of Allegheny (now Butler). 11 Oct 1871

VERNER, MRS. E. S.—wife of John R. Verner and daughter of Capt. John Young, Jr.; aged 45 years; Aug. 7th, at her home in Robinson Twp., Allegheny Co., Pa. 11 Oct 1871

MCKINNEY, MRS. ELIZABETH—widow of Joseph McKinney; died in New Concord, Ohio; Aug. 19th; age 76 years. She was born in Washington Co., Pa. in 1795. She was married in her native state, but soon afterward removed to Ohio and lived near by and in the village of New Concord, Muskingum Co. more than half a century. Member of the Presbyterian Church of Pleasant Hill. Eleven years ago, her husband died, in the same month of the year. 11 Oct 1871

- BLACK, MRS. ISABELLA—at the home off her son, J. H. Black, Esq., in Green Twp., Harrison Co., Ohio on the 12th of September. Relict of late Jas. Black, in the 82nd year of her age. She was born in Brook County, W. Va., near Wellsburg and came to Ohio with her widowed mother, Mrs. Hervey, in April 1806. She was married in May, 1812; her husband died in 1865. Two sons and a daughter remain. Member of Beech Spring Church. 11 Oct 1871
- KISKADDON, MRS. MARY ANN—at her residence in Slate Lick, Armstrong County, Pa, April 26th. Widow of the late Robert M. Kiskaddon. She was born in Armstrong County, Pa., Oct 2nd, 1817. Member of the Presbyterian Church of Slate Lick for 25 years. 11 Oct 1871
- JONES, ROBERT C.—at his residence in Bridgeport, Ohio, September 30th; aged 65 years, 2 months, and 1 day. 18 Oct 1871

- SLOAN, ALICE—infant daughter of John and Prudence Sloan, aged 12 hours, September 4th, near Congruity, Pa. 18 Oct 1871

DUNHAM, THOMAS—near Fredericksburg, Ohio, Sept. 8th; aged 63 years and
9 days. Born in Fayette County, Pa., removed with his parents in 1814 to
Wayne County, Ohio. In 1830, he married Margaret Hatfield, who survives.
They had a family of ten children, seven are still living. 25 Oct 1871

MILLER, JOHN—in memoriam, ruling elder of Second Presbyterian Church in
Mercer, Pa. Died 2nd inst. 25 Oct 1871

of William and Jane Crawford, in the 23rd year of her life. At school in

FARIS, HATTIE BLANCHE—at Neoga, Ill., Oct 22nd, of typhoid fever, third daughter of Rev. W. B. and Adaline E. Faris, aged 5 years and 4 months.

JONES, ROBBY GLENN—October 22nd, at 228 First Street, Southeast, Capitol Hill, Washington, D.C.; son of Thomas Glenn and Lizzie K. Jones, aged seven years, lacking four days. His paternal grandfather, whose name he bore, passed away only a few weeks since.

Born and brought up near Greencastle, Franklin Co., Pa. where she united with the Associate Reformed Church. In 1815, she removed, with her father's family, to Washington County, Pa., and settled on Pigeon Creek and united with the church of Mingo. Leaves an aged husband and six children. Buried in Pigeon Creek Cemetery.

JACK, JAMES—known as “Father Jack”, at Le Claire, Iowa, 20th Sept.; in the seventy-second year of his life. He was a native of Allegheny County, Pa.; united with the church of Bull Creek in 1824. In 1839 removed with his family to Iowa. Leaves a wife and one son. Three children died before him 8 Nov 1871

CRUSAN, SARAH MAUD—aged 4 years, died 19th ult.

CRUSAN, JEANETTE M.—aged 7 years, died 30th ult.

All children of Y. and M. Crusan of Bolivar, Pa. Died at the house of Mr. J. M. Peebles, in Pleasant Unity, of scarlet fever. 8 Nov 1871

COULTER, WM. ESQ.—Oct 26, near Elderton, Armstrong County, Pa.; aged 78 years, 11 months, and 23 days. 8 Nov 1871

SOWARS, MRS. SUSANNA P.—in Cowanshannock Township, Armstrong County, Pa., in the 79th year of her age. 8 Nov 1871

GLENN, WARREN THOMPSON—dedication to memory; aged 14 months, 11 hours; son of A. P. and A. M. Glenn, Leland, Mich. 15 Nov 1871

KOOSER, LUCETTA THOMPSON—June 10th, in Rayne Township, Indiana Co., Pa., near Kelleysburg, of diphtheria; daughter of Josiah and Martha Kooser, aged 17 years, 1 month, and 7 days. 15 Nov 1871

KOOSER, MARTHA ELLA—June 11th, in Rayne Township, Indiana County, Pa., near Kelleysburg, of diphtheria; daughter of Josiah and Martha Kooser, aged 8 years, 1 month. 15 Nov 1871

KOOSER, MARY—on July 25th, in Rayne Township, Indiana County, Pa., near Kelleysburg, of diphtheria; eldest daughter of Josiah and Martha Kooser; aged 25 years and 26 days. 15 Nov 1871

KELLY, WM.—at Blairstown, Iowa, September 17th; in the 44th year of his age. He was a son of Moses Kelly and was born in Juniata County, Pa. Twenty years ago, removed to Illinois. Wife and six children are left behind to mourn. 15 Nov 1871

SUMMERVILLE, JAMES, ESQ.—of softening of the brain, on the 23rd of Sept. at his residence in Jefferson Co., Pa; in the 60th year of his age. He came to Jefferson Co., with his father's family in 1829. In June, 1838, he was married to Miss Nancy Caldwell of Allegheny. They had ten children, seven survive. His wife died in Aug. 1866. He married Miss Jennie Graham of Pittsburgh on 1 Jan 1869. 15 Nov 1871

M McNULTY, MRS. LAVINIA—at the residence of her son, Wm. McNulty, near Boonville, Mo.; in her 75th year on the 4th of October. She was born in Washington Co., Pa., moved to Columbus in 1859 and to Missouri in 1869. 15 Nov 1871

RISHER, MRS. REBECCA—at Amity, Allegheny Co., Pa., Aug. 26th; wife of Daniel Risher, Jr.; aged 30 years. Leaves a husband and six young children. 15 Nov 1871

Rose Point Academy Lawrence County, Pennsylvania

The nineteenth century was a period of time during which the American citizenry was trying to determine the nature of what we now refer to as secondary education. While the populace was beginning to recognize the merit of education on that level, questions remained about how many years were necessary and how should it be funded—by the parent or through tax dollars? Indeed, was it legal to use tax dollars? The last question was answered by the decision in the Kalamazoo Case (1875) which validated the use of tax money.

When New Castle High School opened in 1853, it was one of the earliest public secondary schools in the Commonwealth. Other communities in Lawrence County were decades later in opening publicly funded secondary schools and when they did the program was for three years or less. Enter the entrepreneurial spirit of American capitalism. To fill the vacuum, private proprietary schools rose up all over the country side. They were titled a number of different ways: normal school (an elementary school teacher preparation institution), academy, institute, college/university (in name only), seminary (a place where things/ideas grow, are nourished, and bloom), select school, etc. The common thread is that they were being operated by individuals seeking to meet a need while turning a profit. Start-up monies were often generated through subscriptions or the sale of stock. Rose Point Academy was such an endeavor. There was yet another type of private secondary school that is seldom noted by scholars. Because secondary schools of any nature were few and far between, many *bona fide* colleges operated their own preparatory or “feeder schools.”

Late in the 18th century several hundred of these institutions were operating across the Commonwealth. What happened to them? A few like Shady Side Academy or the Ellis School are still operating. Others morphed into something totally different. Carrier Seminary is now Clarion University of Pennsylvania. Most simply went out of business. Some of them transferred their property to the local public school district. Tewkesberry's assessment of the collegiate scene during the early 1800's is appropriate for this period. He noted these institutions "pop up in our nutritious soil like mushrooms after a spring storm. They are dully puffed and lauded for a day and then sink to be heard from no more".

Frequently, the institution's principal was a general factotum. He developed the curriculum, did the advertising, hired the faculty, did some teaching, paid the bills and kept the monies that remained. Sometimes he used his own money to erect a dormitory. If that happened to be the case, his wife probably did the cleaning and cooking for the students and sometimes was an instructor at the school.

Rose Point Academy

The Rose Point Academy Association was chartered in 1891. It was to be capitalized through the sale of two hundred shares of stock at \$25 per share. The names of the initial shareholders who signed the charter document appear below. Their place of residence is Rose Point (Slippery Rock Township, Lawrence County) unless noted otherwise. Shares of stock held are noted in parenthesis. The reader should bear in mind the difficulty in transcribing deteriorating hand written documents.

Classes started sometime in the fall of 1891. There is no extant record of the names or numbers of students or faculty for that year. However, court house records imply that the institution was immediately in financial difficulty. During the spring of 1892 the Academy mortgaged its assets to acquire a \$1,000 loan.

The only official institutional record available is the *Second Annual Catalogue of the Rose Point Academy for the Academic Year 1892-93*. From it we learn "The object of the school is to furnish the foundation of a solid education. Its place is between the common school and the college." The academy had three departments—Normal, College Preparatory and Scientific—but listed the students under the categories of academic, literary and music. Rose Point Academy had the authority to grant diplomas and the B. S. Degree. There is no evidence that it actually conferred the latter. The following rosters are from the 1892-93 *Catalogue*. It should come as no surprise that many of the family names of students appear on the rosters of initial stockholders and trustees.

Between 1891 and 1901 Rose Point Academy sporadically submitted data to be included in the annual *Report of the Pennsylvania Superintendent of Public Instruction* (RPSPI). Information gleaned from these reports indicates that during the decade the top enrollment was about one hundred during the decade while the faculty did not exceed six. During the 1897-98 academic year tuition was \$22.50 per term and board was \$1.50 per week. Principals listed in the reports are

The last entry for Rose Point Academy in the RPSPI for 1900-01 indicates twenty-nine students, one faculty member, and ten library books. According to the report, the demise of Rose Point Academy in 1901 reduced the number of proprietary secondary schools in Lawrence County to one—Volant College (see WPGSQ Vol. 34). Rose Point's property was sold at a Sheriff's Sale in 1911, the same year that Volant College closed its doors.

This is the first in a series of articles dealing with defunct secondary schools in late nineteenth century/early twentieth century Lawrence and Mercer Counties. The next will address New Castle College.
