

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

The paper was published under the name *The Presbyterian Banner* from 1860 to 1898. ROSBOROUGH, JOHN SR.—at Washington, Pa., April 2d, in the 90th year of his age. Father of Rev. H. O. Rosborough of Smithfield, Pa. Member of Presbyterian church of Washington, Pa. 1 May 1872

McFARLAND, JOHN H.—at Burgettstown, Pa., March 12th, of chronic diarrhœa. Brother of Rev. S. G. McFarland. 1 May 1872

HANNA, ISAAC NIXON—March 17th, of pneumonia, oldest son of Rev. Wm. Hanna, aged 21 years, 7 months, and 3 days. Member of Fairview Presbyterian church at Muntown. 1 May 1872

STEWART, D. J.—November 18th, of consumption, at the residence of his brother-in-law, John Griffith, Clarion County; aged 28 years, 1 month, and 14 days. Member of the Presbyterian church of Freeport. 1 May 1872

CUMMINGS, MRS. RACHEL—at Emlenton, Venango County, April 8th, in the 77th year of her age. Early in life joined Rock Presbyterian church in Cecil County, Maryland. Widowed in 1837 with six children. Two daughters deceased; three sons and one daughter survive her. 1 May 1872

CRAWFORD, MRS. MARGARET—at Freeport, Pa., February 21st, of diphtheria, aged 32 years, 26 days. Wife of Samuel C. Crawford. Born on 26 January 1840 in Westmoreland County, joined Unity church in 1858; married 8 Aug 1865. Three children. Member of church in Freeport; buried at Unity. 1 May 1872

- HUFFMAN, W. J.—in West Elizabeth, March 16th, in his 47th year. 1 May 1872
- YOUNT, MRS. CATHARINE—April 11th, aged 41 years, 4 months, and 27 days. Of Rural Valley, Armstrong County. 1 May 1872
- LANG, HENRY W.—March 31st, at his residence in the 21st ward of Pittsburgh, in the 76th year of his age. 1 May 1872
- TAPPAN, BENNIE—at Mt. Pleasant, Iowa, April 17th, of inflammation of the brain, infant son of Rev D. S. and Anna G. Tappan, aged 7 months and 21 days. 1 May 1872
- SMITH, DR. J. PATTERSON—at his residence in Geary, Kansas, February 18th, of disease of the heart, in his 59th year. Son of the Rev. James Smith and Sarah Smith, orphaned at age 5. One brother, the late Rev. Thomas T. Smith and one sister, who died at age 21. He was born in Washington County in 1813, received his M.D. at the Medical College, Columbus, Ohio. Was an elder in the Doniphan, Kansas, Presbyterian church. 8 May 1872
- HUGHES, JAS.—at his residence near Hickory, Pa., Mary 12th, of paralysis, in the 78th year of his age. 8 May 1872
- STEWART, MARY—widow of late Richard Stewart, Sr., aged 74 years, 9 days, of rose cancer. Died February 19th at the home of her son, Jas. R. Stewart in Green Township, Beaver County. She was born in Lancaster County, 12 February 1788 and married 12 April 1821. Mother of five sons, three daughters; three sons and a daughter still living. One son was Rev. J. B. Stewart of Davenport. 8 May 1872
- MEANS, MARY JANE—wife of Mr. Whitesell J. Means, died in Allegheny on 14th January in the 47th year of her age. Member of UPC, White Oak Springs, until 1854, when she joined First Presbyterian church of Allegheny 8 May 1872
- REESE, MRS. SUSAN—April 29th, aged 63 years. 8 May 1872
- HUME, THOMAS W.—April 6th, at Congruity, aged 34 years. 8 May 1872
- BIDLER, SIMON—April 29th, at New Derry, Westmoreland County, aged 27 years, 1 month, and 13 days. Member of Lutheran church. 8 May 1872
- MCCAY, SARAH J.—in Blairsville, Pa., April 4th, relict of Rev. David McCay, in the 49th year of her age. Leaves three daughters. 15 May 1872

HAYS, ENOCH—of apoplexy, February 13th, in the 70th year of his age. Joined Presbyterian church at Raccoon, elder in church of Washington and Three Springs. Lived 41 years in Brook County, West Virginia. 15 May 1872

WEST, MATTHEW H.—February 5th, of Baldwin Township, Allegheny County, in the 73rd year of his age. 15 May 1872

WEST, MARY GLASS—July 10th, 1870, wife of Matthew, in the 58th year of her age. 15 May 1872

MCCLURE, MARY WEST—June 5th, 1871, daughter of Matthew, in the 49th year of her age. 15 May 1872

WEST, ANNA M. G.—May 11th, 1870 in the 20th year of her age. 15 May 1872

WININGS, MRS. MARY—April 22nd, wife of William Winings, in 69th year of her age, member of New Alexandria Presbyterian church. 15 May 1872

GRAYSON, HON. JOHN—March 11th, at his residence in Washington, Pa., in the 89th year of his age. Born in Ireland, spent his youth in Carlisle, Pa. Printer since 1805. Served one year in Baltimore Volunteers in 1812, then in regular Army until the end of the war. Married Martha, daughter of John Wray of Baltimore. Since 1817, a resident of Washington. (Lengthy obituary.)

MILLIGAN, HUGH—April 1st, near Triadelphia, West Virginia, in the 87th year of his age. Born in Berkley County, Virginia, moved to Ohio County as a child and remained. Member of Forks of Wheeling Presbyterian church. Three sons, six daughters. One son, Rev. Josiah Milligan is pastor of Presbyterian Church, Princeton, Illinois; one daughter is wife of Rev. Wm M. Ferguson of Washington, Ohio. Wife and three children preceded him in death. 22 May 1872

GORMLY, MRS. LOUISA B.—May 8th, at Cleveland, Ohio, of disease of the liver, wife of John A. Gormly, Esq., of Bucyrus. Born in Brownsville, Pa. 22 May 1872

DIBLE, JACOB, ESQ.—April 9th, in 92nd year. Born at Markle's Mill in 1780, lived in Franklin Township, Westmoreland County since age 4. Member of German Lutheran Church until age 30 when he joined Plum Creek Presbyterian. 22 May 1872

HALL, MRS. EMMA—at Dickson, Tennessee, on April 16th, of disease of the heart and dropsy, in the 84th year of her age. Joined church in New Brighton in 1862 and removed to Dickson with her husband in 1869. 22 May 1872

TUTTLE, MINNIE OTHELLA—May 10th, in Allegheny City, only child of William J. and Rachel A. Tuttel, age 1 year, 8 months, 10 days. 22 May 1872

HUGHES, DANIEL B.—April 19th, at New Plymouth, Ohio, of consumption, in the 25th year of his age. Son of Rev. David Hughes. Leaves a wife. Daniel's daughter, Carrie, aged seven months, died a few weeks ago. 22 May 1872

WEAVER, DR. JOHN—at Canonsburg, March 18th, of hemorrhage of the lungs, in the 37th year of his age. 22 May 1872

CAMPBELL, JOHN REA—near Cambridge, Guernsey County, Ohio, aged 23 years, 1 month, and 10 days, of congestions of the lungs. Son of Dr. William and Emily Campbell. (no date of death) 22 May 1872

DOWNING, ALEXANDER—April 28th, of heart disease, at his residence near Lloydsville, Belmont County, Ohio, aged 68 years, 4 months, and 20 days. 22 May 1872

CALDWELL, MRS. NANCY—May 14th, in the 67th year of her age, wife of Elder Wm. S. Caldwell of Rehoboth, formerly Sewickly. Two sons are Presbyterian ministers; daughter is wife of Rev. G. B. Smith, of the Presbyterian Church of Seward, Nebraska. 29 May 1872

TATE, MARY ANN—March 11th, at the residence of R. M. James, Esq., Oil City. Aged sixty-five years. 29 May 1872

BOYD, MRS. SARAH—on March 2nd, at her residence near Tarentum, Pa. Wife of Elder John Boyd, in her 57th year. Daughter of Covenanter parents; she adopted the church of her husband. 29 May 1872

WONSFORD, SUSAN BELLE—February 23rd, of typhoid fever. Aged 16 years, 6 months, and 15 days. Joined Presbyterian Church of Bethany in 1871. 29 May 1872

PHILLIPS, JAMES HARVEY—at his residence near Millersburg, Ohio, November 6th, 1871. Aged 58 years, of apoplexy. Born in Allegheny County, October 4th, 1813; came with his family to Holmes County, Ohio in 1865. 29 May 1872

SLAGLE, HON. JACOB—at the residence of his son-in-law, Francis McConnell, Esq., in Pittsburgh, June 7th. The deceased was born in Baltimore, son of Christian Slagle of Germany and Anna Charlotte, daughter of Bernard Wolff of Lancaster, Pa. The father died in 1794 and the family moved to Chambersburg, Pa. Jacob Slagle first came to Washington in 1804 to work with his brother-in-law David Eckert. Jacob settled in Washington in 1814 after living briefly in Wellsburgh, W. Va.. Married Mary, daughter of James Marshall of Wellsburg. She died in 1817, leaving an infant son; Jacob married Mrs. Martha McKemmy, daughter of Joseph Allison of Chambersburg, in 1819. Nine children from the second marriage. Mrs. Slagle died in 1858 in St. Louis. Jacob was buried in the family plot in Washington Cemetery. 26 Jun 1872

The Westminster College Preparatory School
Lawrence County
Part I: The Two Year Program
1854-55 through 1875-76

Westminster College is a church-related liberal arts college located in New Wilmington, Lawrence County. It was established in 1852 by the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, now the Presbyterian Church USA. According to the historical marker placed at the main intersection in town by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, "It was one of the first two institutions in Pennsylvania to grant a degree to women and the first to grant the A.B. degree." Writing in 1886, Wickersham noted that "Westminster is probably the only College in the State, not established for that race, that never excluded persons of color." The College's first Bulletin (1853-54) lists some 250 students. The seven member faculty included six male preachers and one female lay person. That fledgling institution was a far cry from the current Westminster with a student body of about 1500 and a faculty of about 100. The College's home page lists the following current high lights:

As the reader may recall from the first article in this series, the first public high in Lawrence County opened in New Castle in 1853. There were no others in the County for decades. So where does a self-respecting college find qualified candidates for admission? The answer is to grow your own. During the 1800s and early 1900s many higher education institutions established their own preparatory programs. This writer refers to them as "grow your own" or "feeder" programs. Since the curriculum of most liberal arts colleges focused on the classics, it was only natural the preparatory program would prepare a prospective college student in this area. Hence, the preparatory school curriculum was heavily loaded with the study of Latin and Greek. The earliest record of a preparatory program at Westminster College is for the 1855-56 academic year. It was two years in length, subsequently evolving into a three and then a four-year program.

Because of the number of years and the sheer number of names involved, the material will be published in sections. This first section covers the years when a two year program was in operation, 1855-56 through 1875-76. As noted several places in this manuscript, some Bulletins are not available.

An effort has been made to avoid repetition of names through a coding system. The number '2' following a student's name indicates that the student was enrolled as a second year student the following year. If the academic year is repeated or the second occurrence is two or more years later, the name will reappear. All residences are Pennsylvania unless otherwise noted. Institutional terminology is used throughout.
