

As with Part II, Part III should be considered a new beginning; the names of students who were listed Part II may appear again in the first year of this section. Thereafter an effort will be made to eliminate name repetition from year to year. Starting in the 1894-95 academic year the program classifications were Third Preparatory Class and Second Preparatory Class. A '3' after the name of a Second Preparatory Class student indicates enrollment the next year as a third year student. However, if an academic year is repeated or the next occurrence is two or more years later the name will reappear. Also, if a student died during the following year, the name will appear both years. All residences are Pennsylvania unless otherwise noted. Institutional terminology is used throughout.

Pittsburgh's Civil War Angels of Mercy

President Abraham Lincoln's call to arms mustered thousands of men onto battlefields North and South. Early returns from the front lines brought grim news of soldiers in urgent need of medical care.

Prior to the Civil War the government did not have cause to deal with medical cases in such large numbers. There were no humanitarian organizations, such as the American Red Cross, with public nursing health programs standing ready to volunteer. The nursing sisters of Catholic organizations such as the Sisters of Mercy and Sisters of Charity were not only well prepared, but also willing to serve, having rendered excellent service during the numerous cholera epidemics in Pittsburgh.

The service records of the nuns are amongst the records of some 21,000 women that can be found within *Carded Medical Records of Hospital Attendants, Matrons, and Nurses, 1861-65* (RG 94, Entry 535) Records of the Adjutant General's Office, 1780's-1917 at the National Archives. This series of cards shows the name of the individual, hospital muster roll and date of original record, when attached, capacity in which employed, by whom and to what date last paid, whether present or absent, and remarks. The cards are arranged by initial letter of the individual's surname.

Civil War nurses were trailblazers in a field that, until 1861, was reserved for men. There was resentment by many male physicians toward women entering the field of medicine and often doctors preferred the Sisters of Mercy or Charity to assist them. Charles Tripler, medical director of General McClellan's Army of the Potomac was quoted as saying "We can get female nurses through Miss Dix [Dorothea Dix, Superintendent of Women Nurses] and from among the [Catholic] Sisters ... but in the honest discharge of my duties, though a Protestant myself ... I declare that in my opinion the latter are far preferable to the former, being better disciplined, more discreet and judicious, and more reliable."

On November 26, 1862 at the invitation of the Honorable Edwin M. Stanton, Secretary of War, Sisters of Mercy from Pittsburgh took control of Stanton Military Hospital, Washington, DC. Well trained by the physicians at Mercy

Hospital, the sisters served at this facility throughout the war and at one time cared for as many as 500 soldiers.

It is reported that after numerous failed requests for essentials such as eggs, beef or chicken, Sister Otilia Duche and Sister Helen Devlin took matters into their own hands. Securing a wagon, the sisters set off and returned with their carriage full of the provisions they needed. A few days later the following official notice arrived at the hospital:

To Whom it Might Concern:

On application of the Sisters of Mercy in charge of Military hospital in Washington, furnish such provisions as they desire to purchase and charge the same to the War Department.
